Selected deejays will earn a position for the summer at Summer Waves Water Park, a \$1000 scholarship to the college or university of their choice, hands-on broadcast experience through partnerships with local radio stations, not to mention a giant leap into the field of radio broadcast and promotions.

Selected deejays will play a crucial role in Summer Wave Water Park's 2006 RadioWaves program. In addition to hosting the RadioWaves on-air programming, deejays' duties include:

- Live remotes and visitor interaction in the park
- Appearances at in-park and off-site promotional events
- Hosting duties for the RadioWaves Concert Series events
- Remote call-ins with partner radio stations in the area
