- » 38 total responses
- 3. Public Meeting Present Draft Code Revisions
 - » November or December, 2021





Public Meeting on August 15, 2021

- » Structural integrity of buildings; inspections to ensure quality construction and required maintenance, especially after major storms.
- » How will existing uses and situations be grandfathered in?
- » There is a need to regulate rental houses in neighborhoods on Jekyll Island. Most importantly regulate the number of cars parked at a rental house
- » Questions about how design guidelines apply to residential properties
- » The design review group would benefit from citizen involvement SEKYLLTISLAND such as members representing residents
- » Comments about feral cats and regulations for animal control

Online Survey

- » Brief survey to gather input about which topics are most important to Jekyll Island.
- » Online with link from JIA web site
- » Open from August 23 through September 3
- » Six (6) questions
- » 38 total respondents
- » Gathered valuable feedback on what level of interest in the development codes
- » Asked about future plans for activity that would be interacting with the codes






Survey Results – Question 1:

Survey Results – Question 2:

What are the top three (3) topics you feel should be addressed in the code that are not already included in the code?

- 1. Limiting future overdevelopment of island.
- 2. Parking. Especially at rental properties, parking on lawns, boat trailers, number of vehicles, and visitors street parking.
- 3. Code Enforcement. Better clarity for enforcement of property maintenance and use.
- 4. Traffic. Related to overdevelopment and increasing number of visitors to island.
- 5. Stormwater management and flooding.



Survey Results – Question 3:

What are the top three (3) subjects you feel need to be revised in the current code?

- 1. Limiting future over development of island
- 2. Stronger regulations to limit and deny development and re-development in areas known to be threatened by coastal hazards, flooding, and storm surge.
- 3. Outdoor storage and parking in residential areas
- 4. Require compliance with development standards through leases, as well as codes
- 5. Property maintenance. Owners should be required to maintain landscaping and exterior of homes. Tree trimming is too restrictive for minor branches.



When you think about the future of Jekyll Island, please rank the following topics in order of importance to you:


